tics. Projections show that by the year 2050, Hispanics will comprise 24% of the population with a total of 102.6 million people.

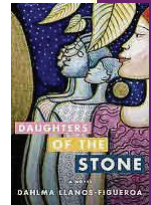
It is clear from these numbers that economically, culturally, and politically, Hispanics are an integral part of our nation.

It is the world's largest grassroots network of breast cancer survivors and activists.

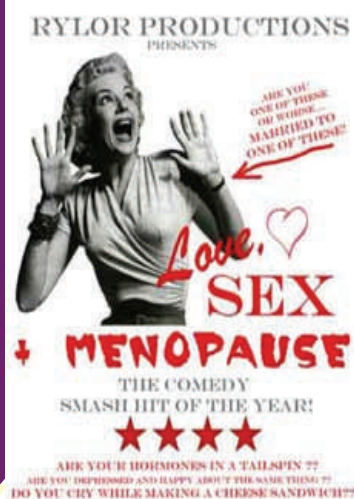

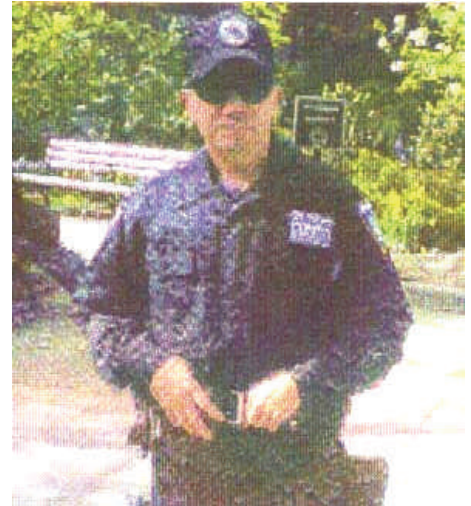
